- C. 51.01.03 Promotional Bags
 - This motion is to allocate \$3,000 of the Green Fee to purchase for the purchase of 500 Reusable Jute Monster Grocery Bags.
 - (i) The sustainability council wants to have these bags for the purpose of promoting SSA and the sustainability council.
 - (ii) Will be passed out at events like listening sessions and sustainability events such as climate strikes or Earth Week.
 - 1. Approved with unanimous consent
- D. 51.01.04 Resolution for Dining Services to implement
 Sustainable and Diverse Foods
 - This resolution recommends that UDS provide more sustainable food options and an increase in vegan, vegetarian, gluten free, and culturally diverse food options.
 - (i) This was spearheaded last year with listening sessions about food quality on campus. Responses reported




that there was a lack of cultural foods and food accommodations for individuals with diet limitations.

- (ii) Easily implemented changes for UDS with local ingredients that are organic/sustainability grown. Goal outlines of increasing local food, host event for meeting farmers, increase food options, increased third party food and beverage purchases, gluten free pantry, culturally inclusive, transparency with food purchases, education for marketing of food, and student position to promote inclusivity options.

- C. 36.09(5) before any edits: The students of each institution or campus subject to the responsibilities and powers of the board, the president, the chancellor and the faculty shall be active participants in the immediate governance of and policy development for such institutions. As such, students shall have primary responsibility for the formulation and review of policies concerning student life, services and interests. Students in consultation with the chancellor and





subject to the final confirmation of the board shall have the responsibility for the disposition of those student fees which constitute substantial support for campus student activities. The students of each institution or campus shall have the right to organize themselves in a manner they determine and to select their representatives to participate in institutional governance.
