Title: Support for a Temporary Grading Policy for Fall 2020

Whereas, COVID-19 has caused an extraordinary amount of stress on both students and instructors alike;

 Whereas, the disruption to the learning environment by COVID-19 and its effects is not the fault of any instructor or student, and no person can or should be held at fault to actions that are outside of their control:

Whereas, instructors have been asked to do unprecedented things to conform with campus safety guidelines, such as changing teaching modality, create new teaching methods to help students who are quarantined or are in isolation due to COVID-19, and risk the health and safety of themselves and loved ones in service of students;

Whereas, these changes have impacted the quality of education that students are receiving, despite the best efforts of all involved to ensure that impact is minimal;

Whereas, this decline in quality of education has negatively impacted students and will negatively impact their performance within their courses.

Whereas, a student's transcript has plays a large role in a student's ability to gain employment and/or continue along their career path.

Be it therefore resolved, we, the University Student Senate of the Stout Student Association call upon the Educational Activities Committee, Faculty Senate, and the University of Wisconsin Stout to take the following action to ensure that students are treated with the compassion and understand that everyone deserves:

- Solicit and gather feedback from stakeholders including but not limited to students, instructors, and program directors to identify the options that can best support students.
- 2. Develop a temporary grading policy that considers the unexpected and extraordinary impacts of COVID-19 on the learning environment and addresses the real and valid concerns that students have with how their transcript may be affected.
- 3. This policy should show compassion and flexibility to students who face unforeseen circumstances during the semester, and not have arbitrary and unsubstantiated deadlines for decisions.
- 4. Clearly communicate this policy to all students and be willing to revisit the policy if need be if it is discovered that alternative solutions can better fit the needs of students.
