Student Workshop: Black Bodies, White Artists

Do white artists misappropriate Black culture when they address racial injustice from a culturally dominant perspective? "Black Bodies, White Artists" will feature works of art that have generated a lot of controversy in recent years. Should artists be able to represent any topic they want, no matter their race or identity? Or is there a danger in depicting the Black experience from an outsider's perspective? A variety of perspectives and opinions will be discussed in the workshop.

NOTE: Some of the art discussed will include graphic or violent imagery. Prior to the workshop, registered students will receive a document with links to readings and artwork to review to prepare for the workshop.

Deadline to apply is February 20, but only 16 students will be accepted, so don't wait to apply! Students who complete the workshop will receive a \$100 stipend. Please provide your student ID number when applying.

This is a non-credit bearing educational enrichment experience.

Dr. Cynthia Bland has been teaching art history at Stout for eighteen years. One of her favorite courses to teach is Art and Controversy because she is passionate about First Amendment issues and conversations surrounding Freedom of Expression.
